

Guidelines for Attending Public Masses starting Weekend 4th & 5th July

- The Sunday / Holyday obligation has been suspended for now. People who are vulnerable or fearful may not wish to come to church at this time, if so you are invited to participate in the Mass via web cam / radio, or to attend Mass during the week.
- Due to the 2 metre distance regulation, the numbers of people admitted to the church will be limited, therefore some seats in the church will be closed off.
- A limited number of people will be allowed per seat (unless from the same family).
- Stewards will show where people can sit.
- There will be floor markings and signage inside and outside the churches to facilitate compliance with the various Government Restrictions.
- There will be also signs on the seats to show where you can sit.
- People are asked to respect social distance and to follow the Stewards instructions.
- There will be **No** standing within the church.
- People are asked to sit during Mass, except while receiving Holy Communion.
- The Reader & Eucharistic Ministers will have reserved seats at the top of church.
- Eucharistic Ministers are required to wear a **face mask or visor** and to distribute Holy Communion to the people in their seats, and not at the Altar.
- The Communion Host will **only** be given on the hand.
- **No Mass Servers** for the duration of the Pandemic.
- As the Offertory Collection Bags will not be passed around, you may place your donation in the Offertory Box / Basket at the Church entrances.
- Our outside loud speaker will enable people to hear Mass outside the church and in their car.
- Eucharistic Ministers will distribute Communion to anyone outside the church and in their car.
- The congregation are asked not to delay outside the church after Mass and to keep following social distance rules.
- People are asked to please, if possible, book Mass intentions by `phone or email to restrict the number of people within the Sacristy.
- We thank you in advance for your considered co-operation in these challenging times.
